First BREEAM certified retail building for Greece

A new retail unit in Athens is the first Greek commercial premises to achieve BREEAM certification. The Greenstore Stamata supermarket achieved a Very Good rating at the post-construction stage in an assessment carried out by Athens-based BREEAM assessor, Ecoveritas, under the BREEAM Europe Commercial 2009: Retail scheme. The 1,334 m² Stamata building owned by the AB Vassilopoulos-Delhaize Group scored well in the BREEAM energy, health and wellbeing, water and management categories.

Sustainable features include:

A building management system (BMS) with real time metering and control

Photovoltaic (PV) panels

Geothermal heat pump

Wind turbine

Rainwater harvesting

Heat recovery in cold storage systems

Sun pipes to enhance natural daylighting

Water metering and a leak detection / prevention system

Electric vehicle charging stations with energy provided by the building's renewable energy systems.

A compactor for packaging waste and the composting of organic waste will help ensure the building's impact in-use will be kept to a minimum through the recycling of nine waste streams for staff and customers.

Carol Atkinson, chief executive of BRE Global said: "The Greenstore Stamata supermarket [demonstrates] how the benefits of sustainability can be gained even in difficult economic circumstances."
